The program will feature a 45 minute national web cast featuring Jon M. Huntsman, the U.S. Ambassador to China. This web cast will be seen in over 50 cities across the U.S. It will be followed by a local discussion among the New Orleans participants of where China is going, to include its changing international posture and the relationship between the

U.S. and China. This discussion will be led by Hank Levine a senior director for the strategic advisory Albright Stonebridge Group. Mr. Levine served in the State Department for 25 years including several senior advisory positions in China. Mr Levine is fluent in Chinese (Mandarin). He is also chair of the Intensive China Area Studies Course at the U.S. State Department.
