Melinda Herrold-Menzies is an Associate Professor of Environmental Analysis at Pitzer College and The Claremont Colleges in the Intercollegiate Program of Environmental Analysis in Claremont, California.

Her research focuses on conflicts around nature reserves and national parks in China and the Russian Far East. Other interests include environmental issues in China, conservation and development, gender issues, and California ecosystems.

Dr. Herrold-Menzies received her doctorate from the Department of Environmental Science, Policy and Management from the University of California, Berkeley, and her M.A. in International Relations from Yale University.



The program will open with a webcast featuring Jon M. Huntsman, Jr., U.S. Ambassador to the People's Republic of China discussing Current Issues in Sino-American Relations. National Committee President Stephen A. Orlins will moderate this 45-minute portion of the program comprised of a 15-minute talk followed by half an hour during which Ambassador Huntsman will respond to questions emailed in from audience members throughout the country. Following the webcast, Dr. Herrold-Menzies will speak and lead the discussion among our attendees.
