Another round of the Northeast Asia Security Dialogue, a Track II collaboration between Stanford University's Preventive Defense Project, the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations and the China Foundation for International and Strategic Studies, was held in Washington, D.C. January 22 - 27. The program began with a lively and provocative two-and-a-half-day discussion among the people listed below, focusing primarily on the current challenges in the Sino-American relationship and paths to working collaboratively on these. The Chinese participants then spent two days meeting with senior government officials (Undersecretaries of Defense Michelle Flournoy and Ashton Carter, Deputy Secretary of State Jim Steinberg, Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Asian Affairs Jeffrey Bader, Assistant Secretary of State Kurt Campbell), commissioners of the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission, scholars from CNA's China Studies Center, and policy analysts at Armitage International and Project 2049.
