



TIMELINE OF NON-PROGRAM FUNDED PUBLIC INTELLECTUAL ACTIVITIES

November 2005

Jim Millward testifies before the Congressional Executive Commission on China on “China's Changing Strategic Concerns: The Impact on Human Rights in Xinjiang.”

January 2006

Helen McCabe is quoted in a South China Morning Post article about Stars and Rain, a Chinese organization she works with that does groundbreaking work in the study of autism and support of families with autistic children and individuals with the illness.

February 2006

Evan Medeiros speaks at the Boise Idaho Council on Foreign Relations on the topic of the rise of China and security implications for the United States.

March 2006

Mark Frazier does multiple outreach activities on the topic of U.S.-China-India relations: he is a guest on a Wisconsin Public Radio program, speaks both to a live audience at the Institute of World Affairs in Milwaukee and on a taped interview with the IWA director that was aired on Milwaukee PBS, and addresses an audience of over 300 employees at Kimberly-Clarke headquarters.

April 2006

Wang Hongying does back to back media appearances: on April 20, she takes live questions from callers as a guest on C-SPAN's Washington Journal and the following evening she talks about the Chinese media on the NewsHour with Jim Lehrer.

July 2006

Wang Hongying is a guest on the PBS program “Foreign Exchange with Fareed Zakaria.”

August 2006

Kellee Tsai testifies before the US-China Economic and Security Review Commission on a panel concerning the health of China's financial system.

January 2007

Wu Weiping debates with Minxin Pei about whether major policy changes would be needed to sustain China's economic growth on the VOA TV show "Pro and Con."

February 2007

Phil Saunders testifies before the US-China Economic and Security Review Commission on U.S.-China interactions in the economic, security, and diplomatic spheres.

March 2007

Ed Steinfeld testifies before the House Committee on Energy and Commerce on the international and developing country aspects of climate change.

May 2007

Wang Hongying speaks at the Rochester Committee on Foreign Relations.

September 2007

Ed Steinfeld publishes an op-ed in the Washington Post in the wake of the food and product safety scare.

Mary Gallagher is quoted in an article by The New York Times on the migrant labor shortage in southern China, does an interview with NPR's "The World" about toy safety, and is interviewed by The Chicago Tribune.
