Prior to assuming his current position in June 2009, Kurt Campbell was the CEO and co-founder of the Center for a New American Security (CNAS) and concurrently served as the director of the Aspen Strategy Group and chairman of the Editorial Board of the Washington Quarterly. Dr. Campbell has served in several capacities in government, including as deputy assistant secretary of defense for Asia and the Pacific, a director on the National Security Council staff, deputy special counselor to the president for NAFTA in the White House, and White House fellow at the Department of the Treasury.



Kalpana Misra (Ph.D. Michigan 1992) is an Associate Professor of Political Science and Associate Dean of the Henry Kendall College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Tulsa. She is the author of *From Post-Maoism to Post-Marxism: the Erosion of Official Ideology in Deng's China* (Routledge 1998), co-author of *Advanced Political Theory* (S.Chand, 1987), and co-editor of *Jewish Feminism in Israel*, (Brandeis/UPNE, 2003). Her articles have appeared in *Asian Survey*, *Contemporary South Asia*, *China Report*, *Economic and Political Weekly*, *Women in Politics*, *Journal of Comparative Asian Development*, and *Strategic Analysis*. Her current research interests are Chinese politics, International Relations, and Women's Movements in India, China, and the Middle East.
