After a 30 year career with Bank of America, **Stephen Huey** brings his corporate and nonprofit relationship management expertise to Out & Equal. As senior vice president for global marketing and corporate affairs, Stephen led Bank of America's mission to advance the economic and social well-being of underserved communities in Northern and Central California. Stephen served earlier as senior vice president/community impact manager for Bank of America's Community Development Bank, where he focused on community development lending, investments, and services. He serves on the Board of Directors of the National AIDS Memorial Grove and previously served as Board of Directors chair for the Asian & Pacific Islander Wellness Center and board member for LYRIC (Lavender Youth Recreation and Information Center) dedicated to LGBT youth. He was the Employer Leadership Council chair for the Transgender Economic Empowerment Initiative at the San Francisco LGBT Community Center, and served on the San Francisco Mayor's Office of Community Investment.

At Out & Equal, Stephen manages the corporate engagement team responsible for a portfolio of Fortune 1000 companies and the development and execution of Out & Equal's corporate fund raising and relationship management activities.

Jordan Long is an associate director of HRC Global at the Human Rights Campaign in Washington, D.C. In that role, Jordan manages HRC Global's fellowship program, which brings advocates from all over the world to Washington to share their experiences while gaining perspectives from HRC's decades of experience advocating for the rights of LGBT people. He will host HRC's first Global Innovative Advocacy Summit in late March, which will gather thirty advocates at HRC's headquarters in a dynamic environment for the exchange of ideas and practices for achieving equality.

Prior to joining HRC, Jordan worked in Brussels for the International LGBTQ Youth & Student Organization and the International LGBTI Association, where he lobbied the European Union for inclusive sexual orientation and gender diversity policies. He ran capacity building conferences across Europe on topics related to sexual orientation, gender identity, and organizational development.

Jordan graduated from Miami University with a bachelor's degree in anthropology and linguistics, the University of Chicago with a master's in anthropology, and the University of Michigan Law School with a law degree.

Manny Yonko has been in the social service and advocacy field for over two decades. He is currently the director of the Family Wellness Program of the Children's Aid Society. Manny has presented at seminars and given presentations as an educator and trainer on a national and international level, working with children, teens and adults where domestic violence and sexual assault is present.

He has provided consultations, technical support and assistance and program development to institutions interested in developing policy and increasing their capacity to effectively address issues of dating and domestic violence. Mr. Yonko has provided counseling and treatment in individual and group settings with child witnesses of domestic violence, and teen and adult survivors. He has a long history of working with those who have used abusive and controlling tactics in their intimate relationships.

Mr. Yonko has been the recipient of numerous recognition and leadership awards, including the PASE [Partnership for After School Education] Setter of the Year award, served as the training coordinator for A CALL TO MEN and has developed multiple curricula designed to train professionals on best practices. Mr. Yonko has dedicated his career and life to helping others heal from the impact of domestic violence. Manny has collaborated with organizations from around the country in an effort to end domestic violence and sexual assault and is committed to improving societal conditions that obstruct the united advancement of people.
